- Discuss how your organization could benefit from this opportunity;
- Describe the population you serve, including how many young people you expect to be impacted;
- Discuss the credentials of any trainers or consultants you will be employing, as well as how you determined that the support strategies this grant would fund are evidence-based;
- Include a project budget;
- Include a brief statement on how you will evaluate the impact of training or services for which you are requesting funds;
- Include documentation of tax exemption status.

We may reach out to you for more information as we review applications. We also welcome your questions.

Follow-up

If your proposal is funded, we request a written report, including evaluation feedback.

Timeline

Proposals are Due on **Oct 15**, **2023**. Decisions will be announced on or before **December 1**, **2023**. A follow-up report is due by **January 31**, **2025** or three months after project completion, whichever comes first.
